Meet the Sixth Form Pastoral Prefects

Our Pastoral Prefects Team is made up of twenty Year 13 students who have been selected to complement the work of the Pastoral Team in supporting younger students so that they can make the most of their time at BGS.

They are affiliated with the Heads of Years 7 to 11 so that they can help with year group events, assemblies and initiatives, such as transition days, revision workshops and induction days. They also lead on whole assemblies promoting national campaigns like Mental Health Awareness Day, Anti-Bullying Week and Safer Internet Day. At lunchtimes the Prefects run a Games Club in the Learning Link, where younger students can drop in to play board games and chat, building up relationships with the older students.

Individual younger students can be paired with prefect mentors so that they have an older role model and friend to talk to at school. All the team has been trained in “listening and signposting” skills and in mental health first aid. They are able to help students with the challenges of life at school and know when and how to access help from teachers, nurses or the counsellor if they recognise that professional help is needed.

The Prefects also offer help with homework through Homework Club and subject help sessions.
