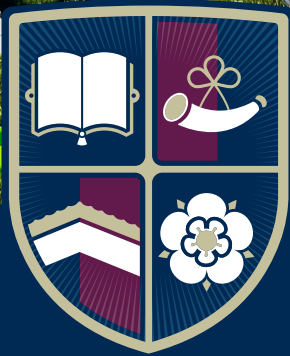

Co-curricular Activities at BGS

The co-curricular programme at BGS is as vital a part of the School's identity as your academic studies. Have a look through this booklet to find out more.

We have a vibrant sports programme which extends beyond timetabled Games sessions. Squad training is put on for those who wish to represent the School in competitive fixtures against other schools and we also put on a variety of sports sessions to which all are invited, irrespective of ability. We believe that every BGS pupil can find something to get passionate about in our wide sporting programme whatever your current level of fitness. Our aim is to prepare young people for life after School by teaching them to enjoy being active as part of a healthy lifestyle.

Music is equally important at BGS. We have an astonishing range of musical ensembles starting with the Junior Orchestra and Junior Choir (all welcome). From there, you might get involved in smaller groups like the Dixieland Crackerjacks or the Close Harmony Group, or you might find your way into the Concert Band, Junior Rock Band or Samba Band. Pretty much every musical genre is covered and again, we aim to put something on to inspire young musicians of all ages, interests and abilities.

Continuing with the theme that every BGS pupil should find something to inspire them in our co-curricular programme, we put on opportunities to volunteer, to get involved in campaigning, to pursue interests in Politics and Philosophy, Coding, Robotics and Lego. We have clubs like the Historical Society and Science Club which allow you to follow an interest you first found in the classroom, you can get creative at our Art Clubs, the Handmade Club and painting tabletop miniatures. And the list goes on!

Academic Enrichment Clubs



Senior Science Club

Explore topics outside of the usual syllabus areas, through discussion and presentation. Experienced members of staff and external speakers, including Old Bradfordians, will facilitate wide ranging sessions which will be both topical and interesting.



Business Society

Business Society provides the opportunity to chat or watch presentations about current business issues, contribute articles to the social sciences magazine 'The Healy', complete business quizzes or take part in enterprise challenges.



Book Club

Expand your reading horizons with BGS Book Club. There are two Book Clubs: one for Years 7 - 9 and another for Years 10 - 11. Warning: our books groups will expand your mind!



Japanese Club

Designed to introduce students to the Japanese language, traditions and culture, students will learn: to talk about themselves and their interests in Japanese; how to use verbs in different tenses; develop some understanding about the Japanese alphabet like Hiragana and Katagana for some foreign words; to use some basic Kanjis for writing.



Science Club

Try out your scientific reasoning and laboratory practical skills as you and your team take on challenges to solve problems, design structures from new materials and meet new science in a practical setting. Investigations will cover the full range of science to be found in Biology, Chemistry and Physics.

Academic Enrichment Clubs



Philosophical Society (Junior and Senior)

The Junior and Senior Philosophical Societies encourage students to enter into philosophical discussion and debate. The Societies are led by staff and students who present on a variety of philosophical issues and topics such as: How do I know what is real? What is time? Am I truly free? The aims of the meetings are to intellectually stimulate and challenge students in a fun, relaxed and informal environment.



Historical Society

Broaden your historical knowledge and get some experience presenting in a friendly and supportive environment at Historical Society. From Medieval to modern, the crusades to the Cold War, there will be something here to tickle your historical taste buds.



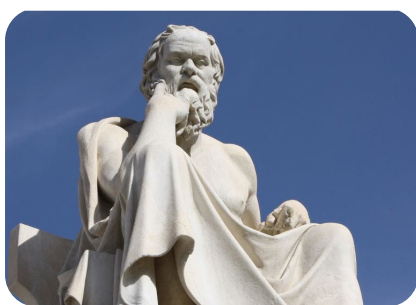
First Lego League Robotics Club

Build and program Lego Mindstorms robots to solve challenges as part of the national First Lego League competition. No previous experience of Lego Mindstorms robots, or programming needed.



Cyber Centurion Club

CyberCenturion is an online competition themed around cybersecurity. Players work in teams of 4/5 to secure a range of computer systems against security threats within a six hour time limit. Beyond the competition, the skills and experience provided by CyberCenturion will set you up for a career in cybersecurity or other related technical careers.



Classics Society

If it's connected to the world of the Greeks and Romans (and that includes most things), it's fair game for the Classics Society, from talks to board games, and from quizzes to craft activities. Perhaps you enjoy reading the Greek myths, or discovered something in your Latin lesson about the Romans that you want to explore further - come along to Classics Society to develop your interest.

Music Ensembles



Choirs

There are four amazing choirs at BGS. Close Harmony Group is a small acapella SATB ensemble, performing pop, jazz and spiritual songs. Senior Chamber Choir is a smaller, auditioned SATB choir for pupils already in Senior Choir. Junior Choir is a large ensemble for all pupils who love singing in Years 7 and 8. Senior Choir is an unauditioned SATB choir - open to everyone. You must be a member of this ensemble if you are in Senior Chamber Choir or Close Harmony Group.



Wickermen

An ensemble specialising in the performance of modern folk music, think Mumford and Sons and Bellowhead. The ensemble comprises of standard 'band' instruments with the addition of other instruments as needed; strings, woodwind, accordion and even a bodhran! Attendance is by invitation. The group performs at all the large school concerts during the year.



Woodwind Ensembles

We have five exciting Woodwind Ensembles running for players of all abilities and experience: Senior flute group, Junior flute group, Senior saxophone group, Junior saxophone group and Clarinet group. All ensembles perform in the small Chamber Concerts throughout the year.



String Ensembles

We have two String ensembles running for players of all string instruments (violin, viola, cello, double bass): Senior string group is an ensemble for all string players. String 'quartet' is for the more advanced string players in the school. The 'quartet' is often expanded to a quintet or larger to accommodate our most advanced performers.



Senior Orchestra

A large ensemble for those more advanced woodwind, brass, string and percussion players (approximately grade 5 and above). The group performs in the large school concerts and plays a variety of music, ranging from film soundtracks to Classical repertoire. This is a great opportunity to experience playing your instrument in a real live orchestra!

Music Ensembles



Samba Band

A group for all percussionists whether you are having lessons or are interested in performing in a percussion ensemble. The group performs in all the large school concerts throughout the year.



Junior Orchestra

A large ensemble for all instrumentalists (approximately grades 1-4). The group performs in the large school concerts and plays a variety of music, ranging from film soundtracks to Classical repertoire. This is a really great opportunity to play your instrument within a real orchestral setting!



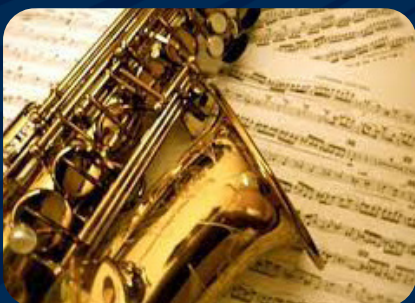
Guitar Groups

We have two ensembles for players of acoustic plectrum / classical guitar: the senior guitar group is for more advanced players of approximately grade 5+ and the intermediate guitar group is for approximately grades 1-4. Both ensembles perform in the small Chamber Concerts throughout the year.



Dixieland Crackerjacks

The Dixieland Band, performs in the large school concerts throughout the year. The ensemble normally comprises of rhythm section, banjo, clarinet and brass. This is an ensemble for advanced performers.



Big Band

A jazz ensemble comprising brass, saxophones, rhythm section and pianist. The group performs at all the large concerts throughout the year.

Music Ensembles



Brass Ensembles

There are two small ensembles for players of all brass instruments: the senior brass group is for more advanced players of approximately grade 5+ and the junior brass group is for approximately grades 1-4. Both ensembles perform in the small Chamber Concerts throughout the year and the senior group also plays at the Carol Service in the Cathedral.



Chamber Orchestra

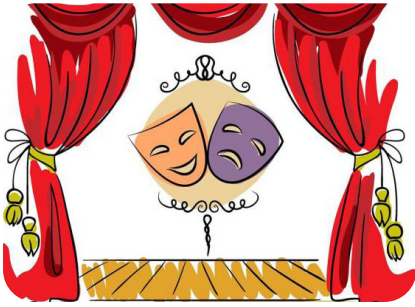
An ensemble for the more advanced string players in the school who wish to challenge themselves performing some of the finest music written for chamber groups.



Concert Band

A large ensemble for those more advanced woodwind, brass, and percussion players (approximately grade 5 and above). The group performs in the large school concerts, the Rugby Parents' Association Christmas Ball and outside school, at the Grassington Festival, and plays a variety of popular music.

Drama



Senior Drama Club (Year 9+)

Senior Drama club is open to any students in Years 9 or above. Each week we explore practical elements of theatre through workshops and devised performances. It is a great opportunity for older students to come and work on their craft.



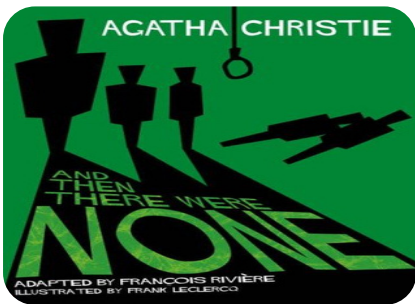
Junior Drama Club (Years 7 & 8)

Every week our Year 7 and 8 Junior dramatists meet to play Drama games, devise from props or costumes, and work on scripts (some of which they may have written themselves). In the summer term we put together a showcase so friends and family can see the skills and confidence developed throughout the year.



Technical Theatre Club

The BGS technical sound and lighting team meet throughout the year in order to support the school's various productions. Students can gain experience in sound operation and/or design, lighting design and/or set construction.



And Then There Were None

Following auditions at the beginning of the school year, preparations begin for our annual drama production - this year it is 'And Then There Were None' by Agatha Christie. If you are interested in performing, working backstage, set design, sound and lighting or costume and make up, get in touch with the Drama Department. Sports Clubs



Rowing

Rowing training on the river takes place on a Saturday morning, all year round. In the case of poor weather or adverse river conditions, training takes place in our fabulously equipped Rowing Gym at school. In addition to Saturdays at the river, indoor training at school takes place at various times. Attendance at these sessions is optional, but beneficial! The sessions are open to all age groups.



Netball

Netball is a rapidly growing sport nationally and BGS has a talented squad which develops girls from beginners to county standard. BGS netball gives opportunities to tour, to compete against other schools and to make new friends in our netball family.



Yoga Club

Feeling stressed? Sick of sitting at a desk all day? Want to loosen up, feel more energised...or relaxed? Then yoga is for you! You will learn how to stretch your body to address particular issues you may be having, or to simply get moving. You'll also learn to control and lengthen the breath, which can help you to feel calmer and more relaxed (and can also help with singing and various sports).



Boys Squash Club

This is a wonderful opportunity for boys to get involved in a sport not on the curriculum. You will meet different people in your year group in a friendly, casual yet sometimes competitive environment. It doesn't matter if you're a total newbie to squash or a more seasoned racquet sports player, everyone is welcome.



Girls Squash Club

Do you fancy trying a new sport? Do you want to have a go at something new? This is a wonderful opportunity for girls to get involved in a sport not on the curriculum. You will meet different people in a friendly, casual yet sometimes competitive environment. It's casual, it's fun, it's energetic and it invites everyone regardless of ability or experience.

Sports Clubs



Table Tennis Club

This is a lunchtime club for pupils who enjoy table tennis. Pupils could get the opportunity to represent school in fixtures against local schools and also in the ESTTA Team Competition. If you enjoy playing table tennis, bring your friends along and challenge them to a game.



Orienteering Club

Orienteering is called 'cunning running' and entails navigating as fast as possible to a selection of checkpoints through a variety of terrain - parkland, woods, streets, and so on. Races can be short or long, and done in daytime or even at night-time. Students will develop their confidence and spatial awareness as well as their fitness - but most importantly, it's fun!



Cross Country

BGS cross country club is one of the most successful in the School, regularly competing at a high level in school and national competitions. BGS currently holds the English Schools Fell Running Championship. Whether you are already a runner or not, this club caters for all abilities and will help you realise your potential.



Athletic Development Programme (ADP)

If you are an active and aspiring young athlete, and want to take your performance and game to the next level, this will provide the opportunity to learn how to train. Sessions will focus on strength, power and plyometrics in the gym and are all about learning, developing and having fun! Whatever your sport, the BGS ADP will improve your performance and reduce the chance of injury.



Swimming

BGS swimming models itself on a national level swimming club. Operating daily before and after school, it has separate sections for elite swimmers (county standard and above) and for those wishing to improve from a lower level. Cricket

We have an extensive co-curricular cricket programme for all students. The use of bowling machines and video analysis are regularly used in sessions. Get moving in the fresh air, build friendships and resilience, and have fun!

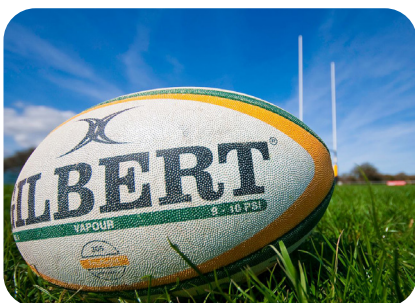
Athletics

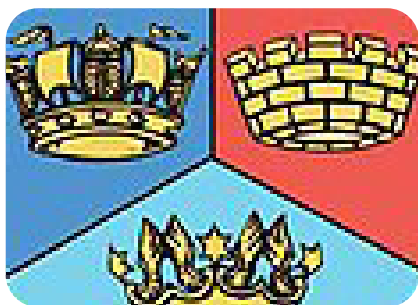
Big Green Society

Politics Society

Duke of Edinburgh

The Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme is the world's leading youth achievement programme for 14-24 year olds. Participation in the Award gives young people experience of working in a team, builds confidence, resilience and fosters independence. These are essential skills that help young people as they progress through life, improving their chances of moving forward in education or furthering a career.



Manningham Youth Talks (MYT)

MYT is a voluntary community group which has been supported by BGS since it was formed in 2009. MYT offers a space for young people of Manningham to talk with each other to discuss current topics in a safe environment. It allows students to talk about issues not normally discussed in school and encourages people to listen to alternative views and perspectives. We are always encouraging students to look critically at the sources of their information. There are fortnightly meetings for Year 12 and 13 pupils and is usually based in school. Occasionally we have guests and sometimes we work with other schools and/or Bradford based organisations.

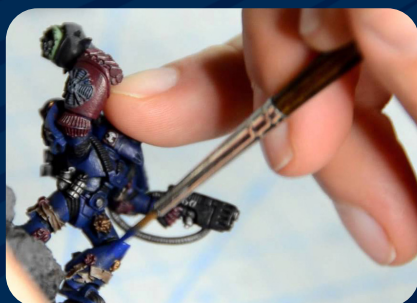
Game Design Club

Miniatures Club

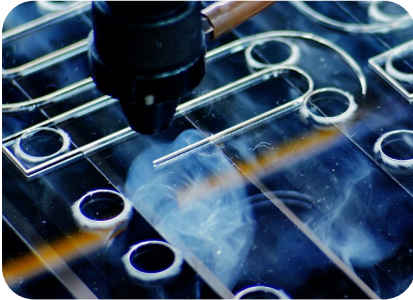

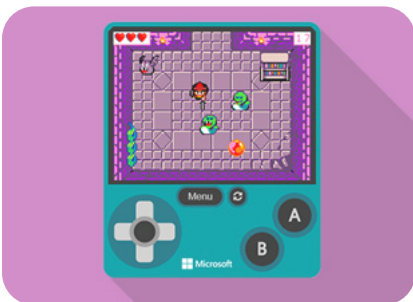
Design & Technology Club

Chess Club

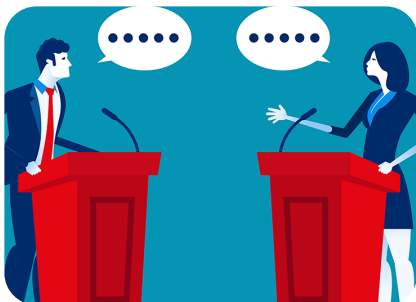
