Draw lines and circles using gross motor movements. Hold pencil/paint brush beyond whole hand grasp pencil grip.	Develop body strength, balance and body co-ordination. Combine sequences of movements. Letter formation. Handle tools, objects, construction and malleable materials, Encourage children to draw freely. Fine motor skills.	Demonstrate strength, balance and coordination when playing. 	Blending CVC sounds, rhyming, alliteration, know that print is read from left to right. Spotting diagraphs in words. Show children how to touch each finger as they say each sound. For exception words such as 'the' and 'said', help children identify the sound that is tricky to spell. Encouraging tripod grip and identify developing hand of preference.
